Pergeesh Construction was created to reacquire as much ancestral territory as possible, to create a thriving economy for the people living on the reservation and to provide employment opportunities for members of the tribe to return to the ancestral territory. Per-geesh, meaning Bald Eagle in Yurok, prides itself on the quality of its work and strives to meet and surpass the expectations of their clients. Pergeesh is headquartered in Klamath, CA with regional offices located throughout CONUS.
